McQueen (15) | 111mins

Dir: Ian Bonhote | 2018

A self-described working-class boy from East London, Alexander McQueen harnessed his demons and went on to become a global one-man fashion brand. A punk rebel and 'Cool Britannia' icon, he often-caused controversy and courted scandal. Captured in never-before-seen home movies and footage shot throughout his career. The film helps us to understand the mystery of why, at the height of his acclaim, he shockingly made the decision to end to it all.

McKellen: Playing the Part (12A) 96mins + Q&A

Dir: Joe Stephenson | 2017

Featuring a Q&A with Director Joe Stephenson. Built around a 14-hour interview, *Playing the Part* uncovers Sir Ian McKellen's story. From his upbringing living through the war, working through repertory and West End theatre, coming out and being a leader in the campaign for equality, to his mainstream film breakouts as Magneto and Gandalf. *Playing the Part* features unprecedented access to private photo albums and never-before-seen archive material.

Seeing Daylight: The Photography of Dorothy Bohm (PG) 45mins + Q&A

Dir: Richard Shaw | 2018

Featuring a Q&A with filmmakers Richard Shaw and Stevie Brennan. To mark Refugee week, we are screening the incredible true story of the Jewish photographer who fled the Nazis. Dorothy Bohn was just a teenager when she arrived in Manchester holding a camera, a parting gift from her father. The film returns Dorothy, now in her 90's, to Manchester where she went on to become one of the most celebrated street photographers of her generation.

My Generation (12A) 84mins

Dir: David Batty | 2017

British film icon Michael Caine narrates and stars in 'My Generation', the vivid and inspiring story of his personal journey through 1960s London. Based on personal accounts and stunning archive footage this feature-length documentary film sees Caine travel back in time to talk to The Beatles, Twiggy, David Bailey, Mary Quant, The Rolling Stones, David Hockney and other star names.
