Everyone's favourite family of superheroes is back – but this time Helen is in the spotlight, leaving Bob at home with Violet and Dash to navigate the day-to-day heroics of normal life. It's a tough transition for everyone, made tougher by the fact that the family is still unaware of baby Jack-Jack's emerging superpowers.

Mamma Mia! Here We Go Again (PG) | 114mins

With the original cast of Mamma Mia returning and new additions including Lily James and music icon Cher this is the hit of the summer. Stacked with ABBA tunes get ready to sing and dance, laugh and love all over again as the film goes back and forth in time to show how relationships forged in the past resonate in the present.

Elvis: '68 Comeback Special 120mins

It's been 50 years since Elvis Presley performed in his legendary 68' Comeback concert recorded on December 3, 1968. Originally airing as a TV special, having not appeared on stage in front of a live audience for more than seven years, this spectacular performance is seen by many as the Memphis icon's most substantial achievement as a stage performer.

The Price of Coal (12A) | 182mins

Dir: Ken Loach | 1977

The Price of Coal is a two-part television drama written by Barry Hines and directed by Ken Loach, first broadcast as part of the Play for Today series in 1977. Set at the fictional Milton Colliery, near Barnsley in South Yorkshire, the episodes contrast efforts made to cosmetically improve the pit in preparation for a royal visit (part one) and the target-conscious safety shortcuts that precipitate disaster (part two). There will be an interval in between parts one and two.
