Paweł Pawlikowski follows his Oscar-winning *Ida* with the stunning *Cold War*, an epic romance set against the backdrop of Europe after World War II. Sumptuously shot in luminous black and white, it spans decades and nations to tell a love story that is as tragic as it is moving, and as transportive as it is honest.

Turkish Star Wars (12A) 91mins

Dir: Çetin İnanç | 1982

Notorious for the ways in which director **Çetin İnanç** edited footage from *Star Wars* into his own film, along with music from *Raiders of the Lost Ark* and *Flash Gordon*, *Dünyayı Kurtaran Adam* (aka *Turkish Star Wars*) is cinema at its most bonkers. It revolves around two Turkish space pilots who crash-land on a desert planet enslaved by an evil wizard. Memorable sequences involve the heroes battling robots inspired by *Battlestar Galactica* and *Forbidden Planet* — plus mummies, skeletons, and multi-coloured yetis.



Under the Wire (15) | 95mins

Dir: Christopher Martin | 2018

On 13 February 2012, war-correspondent **Marie Colvin** and photographer **Paul Conroy** entered war-ravaged Syria to cover the plight of civilians trapped in the besieged Homs, under attack by the Syrian army. Only one of them returned. This is their story.

Claude Monet was an avid horticulturist and arguably the most important painter of gardens in the history of art, but he was not alone.
