This charming and moving comedic drama follows the spiritual journey of Harry Dean Stanton's character 'Lucky', a cantankerous, self-reliant 90-year-old atheist, and the quirky characters that inhabit the Arizona town where he lives. Having out-lived and out-smoked all his contemporaries, the fiercely independent Lucky finds himself at the precipice of life, thrust into a journey of self-exploration, leading towards that which is so often unattainable: enlightenment.

It's the early 1970s, and Ron Stallworth is the first African-American detective to serve in the Colorado Springs Police Department.
